
Spring is upon us but it hasn't stopped production of some cosy stuff!

There was lots of yummy hand-spun...

Two generous skeins from **Giuliana Bond**, a) bamboo multi-coloured and b) grey merino and silk, both chain-plied to obtain a 3ply yarn.



A skein drop-spindled from a 'Colours of the Andes' pack of alpaca – 3 different colours randomly plied together from **MargaretPC**



Gail Campbell knitted a striped alpaca jumper for herself using several differ-

ent skeins of hand-spun alpaca – a little sparkle added to give it a lift.



Gail Hamilton knitted
a light-weight (Spring
is here) 'storm
shawl' (pattern by Soji)
using Dingo Dyeworks 'Ridgydidge'.

Sue Webb knitted a) a stunning angular shawl (pattern 'Namibia') using blended Corriedale/mohair/alpaca hand-spun (20 WPI/3ply) and b) a shrug / bolero in wool dyed with fallen leaves; Sue admitted that it was the most complicated article she has knitted to date.

In addition, the SA Coordinators are looking for a group to come forward to coordinate the event for 2021.



Mary Wright




Cornish Guernseys and Knitfrocks Mary Wright

In the late 19th century Cornish hand knitting was a vital cottage industry, with coastal villages developing their own distinctive patterns and names for the navy blue guernsey. It was almost forgotten until Mary Wright started asking old people what they remembered. Her research has resulted in a remarkable piece of

social history. This book includes detailed instructions and charts to knit a guernsey.

Simply Felt: 20 Easy and Elegant Designs in Wool Margaret Docherty

This book covers the fundamentals of felting including choosing fibre and colours, making flat felt and boiling felt, plus stitching felt. There are 20 projects in this book, going from funky to elegant, amusing to classic. Start with an op shop jumper or a bag of raw wool and you can create handsome, durable fabrics for striking wearables or home decor.

Spinning Study Group 2019



Tips for demonstrators at Guild events

For those of you who haven't done this before, and even for those who have, a few tips on things you might like to know or consider before attending events.

- Turn up when you tell people you are coming or when asked to attend. Otherwise let someone know if you will be late or not coming. It means we can organise to fill in for you or arrange to cover your absence.
- 2. Bring a project that doesn't require a lot of concentration or thought. You will be interrupted.
- 3. Wear your Guild badge. It may help get past the entry points and gives people some idea of who to address if they have a question.
- 4. Be prepared to talk about what you are doing to people who have no idea how things work. Sometimes it helps to have some standard 'patter' to go through. For instance, "Spinning is the basic process of adding twist to fibre. A spinning wheel is one way to do this."
- 5. Bring some water and snacks. Food and drinks may be available but can be expensive and take time to purchase (time you could spend looking at other stands! The organiser of the Guild stand may be able to tell you whether facilities are available to reheat soup or make tea and coffee.
- 6. Be prepared to politely stop people touching or playing with displays and equipment not intended for handling.
- 7. Be prepared for people to take pictures of you without your permission. Some do ask but many don't.
- 8. Enjoy the experience. It can be extremely rewarding to introduce a newly interested 'muggle' to the world of spinning, weaving, knitting, etc.
- 9. If you are bringing your own equipment and are doing multiple days it should be safe to leave it onsite if you want to leave it overnight. That said, all equipment and display articles are left at your own risk.

Weaving workshops 2020

Belinda Rosee of FibreLicious has secured Stacey Harvey-Brown (The Loom Room, France), as the International Weaving tutor for 2020, and will be bringing Stacey to Australia in August 2020.

For those who are not familiar with Stacey, she has been teaching weaving since 2005, firstly at The Loom Room in the UK, and now from her new studio near Nerac, in the heart of Gascony, SW France.

The two workshops being offered are:

- 1. Three Techniques for Texture Workshop—Texture in weaving can mean creating a flat tactile surface, but it can also mean so much more than that... What if you could create ruffles and seersucker, rocks and rills, lava flows and tree bark?
- Honeycomb Hybrid Workshop—Honeycomb is very versatile and crosses many perceived boundaries in weave. This workshops is packed bull of variations and forays into different subject areas such as DDW, honeycomb lace based on overshot threadings, huck lace, weft-faced motifs as well as designing for traditional honeycomb with a twist.

Both of these workshops are round robin style workshops over a two day period. The cost is likely to be around \$150 to \$200 per workshop.
